Early explorers set the stage for the settlement of regional Australia. Head out to the Corner Country and follow in the steps of Sturt to learn about, and experience, more of this wonderful land.

The Corner Country of outback New South Wales was first explored during Charles Sturt's 1845 Inland Expedition.

Whilst Sturt's journey, together with enforced stays at Depot Glen and Fort Grey posed great difficulties for the expedition, today's travelers can trace an approximate route without difficulty.

Along the way are station properties where you can camp beneath the stars near a waterhole once used by Sturt, or bunk down in shearer's quarters or a homestead not far away from his original track.

If hotel or motel accommodation is more to your liking, spend a night at one of several across the region.

Driving at your own pace you will find time to get to know the locations integral to the expedition and gain some perspective of the environment and obstacles that impeded that first great Inland Expedition.
